Why volunteer in Nepal?



Nepal is considered to be one of the most beautiful countries in the world which possesses diverse landscapes ranging from the well-known peaks of the Himalaya to low-lying Terai regions. There are several ethnic groups dwelling(living) in harmony with over 70 languages or dialects and a wide range of traditional festivals celebrated throughout the year.

Statistically seen Nepal is one of the poorest countries in the world. Socially and economically people are less developed due to the low rates of literacy, high rates of poverty and persistent gender imbalance. A large number of people living in rural areas and even in urban areas do not have access to education because these people don't have adequate income to even support their family. Statistics show that 26 percent of the total population living in Nepal is below the poverty line, which means that they earn less

than \$240 a year. These people lack basic facilities such as education and health. Even the government of Nepal is frequently unable to provide adequate education and health acilities throughout the country so both urban and rural areas are forced to live without necessary resources to promote growth and development of their communities.

In reality if we see the life style of people living in the same universe, we can find a vast difference. For example in Nepal 26% of total population lives below the poverty line and are lacking proper health care facilities, education facilities and even nutrition for their children. Volunteering in Schools

Great Wall Nepal provides the opportunity to be together with the students of different levels and share your knowledge with them. As a volunteer, it is important for you to understand the things from Nepalese perspective. Sometime there can be misunderstanding between you and children or the other local staff. Thus you need to have a good interaction and sort out the major reasons of your misunderstanding.

As a Volunteer you can assist with teaching at pre-school, primary, lower secondary and higher secondary levels. At any level, volunteer teachers can teach any of the core subjects such as English, mathematics, science, social sciences, and can initiate extra-curricular activities such as art, music, sports and drama. A teaching qualification is required to teach at secondary level. Professional teachers, TEFL holders, educational charity workers and professional trainers are well placed to teach English and reading classes to Nepali students at secondary and higher secondary levels.

If you are well qualified and experienced teacher and have desire to share your skills, we will provide you an opportunity as trainer for teachers in Nepal.









Teaching in Monasteries

Buddhist monasteries are the centre of both religious practice and education study. There are a large number of Tibetan children living in Nepal following traditional education. The monks learn traditional monastic debate, logic, text-memorization and classical Tibetan Calligraphy as a priority in its curriculum.

These children are from economically backward society and some from the remote regions. They have no access to education of any kind back home. Their parents often can't afford to send their children to school even if a school exists in their village. So the monasteries are only the place which provides them an opportunity for education of Buddha along with modern education.

Apart from the education the monk and nunnery students are provided with the facilities of boarding, food, stationery, medicine, and opportunities to grow and other important needs, free of cost. However the financial constraints the Nepalese government does not provide any financial contributions or subsidy to these students; the education costs are met by voluntary donation.

Your responsibility as a volunteer at a Buddhist monastery is to provide basic conversational English instruction to monks and nunnery students. You will be responsible for planning your own creative English lessons and activities, such as games, drawing and painting, and observe and participate in traditional Buddhist rituals. If the volunteers are interested they can also participate in some monastery run programs and meditation during free time. Your teaching will have a great contribution in the students' life. These children later in the future will be able to explore more scriptures written in English and to circulate Buddhist teaching practice to the whole world.

Program requirements:

- You do not need any formal teacher training or experience to participate, but whatever experience you do have will be taken into account when arranging your day-to-day activities.
 - Eligible to obtain a tourist visa to Nepal
 - A good command of oral and written English
- Volunteers need to be independent, enthusiastic and adaptable, hard-working with an openminded attitude.
 - International volunteers are welcome.

Medical Volunteering

There is a shortage of health professionals in Nepal. So if you possess inner desire to contribute to the improvement in the health of nation, Great Wall Nepal provides you an opportunity to work as a volunteer whether you are doctors, nurses and medical student. As a volunteer you can gain valuable experience in your expertise and learn new professional skills in a developing country.

Nepal lacks enough skilled health manpower. The number of doctors is lower than the standard of WHO. Considering this phenomenon Great Wall Nepal has launched Health Aid Program with the intention of assisting the volunteers to adjust in the field of their profession like health professionals, medical students and public health students. The program includes medical practice in health centers under the guidance of a health supervisor.

Volunteers will participate in empowering local people, helping at health centers, providing primary health care, supporting rural health workers, preparing health reports and taking classes to empower schoolchildren depending on their placement.

Medical Internships:

Great Wall Nepal provides you an opportunity to fulfill your desire to serve in the Developing country. To bring your dream into reality, you should consider Nepal as the best destination joining our medical internship program. You will have firsthand experience in the field of your profession.

As a volunteer you will work in the hospital under the guidance and supervision of Medical professional which enables you to gain valuable experience. You can choose the departments of your interest as per your study and experience: pathology, Surgery, emergency, O.P.D and general treatment. Your participation on any of these serves will be considered as a great contribution.

Rural Health Post Work:

There are several health problems in the rural side of Nepal .It's a pity that the locals suffering from normal diseases sometimes lose their life. So your responsibility in these areas is to assist the local staff and provide basic medical service and help the local to raise their health consciousness. We hope that you will have a great contribution in order to spread health education among the people in the rural areas by organizing various programs.

Rural Health Post Work:

We have already contacts with different organizations in Nepal which are facing the problem due to the lack of physiotherapist. If you are well qualified and experienced physiotherapist we expect you to perform your duty as Trainer. Disabled people in Nepal are often forced to live in dark rooms because their family members feel ashamed of them and are angry at having lost prestige and respect through their relative. Often these individuals live a life

where they feel no love, care or self worth and with no financial support, are often forced to begging in the street.



With the intention of helping these disabled people Great Wall Nepal provides you an opportunity of voluntary work in the schools which are especially for these disabled people. These students, having the several problems, always need love and care. As a volunteer, being together with these students, you will face many challenges. So as a big brother or sister you need to understand their psychology and take the situation under control.

Your duty is to look after these disabled children and you will have also a great role to play even as a teacher working together with the local staff. You will have full authority to organize different program with the co-ordination of the administration like arts and crafts, music, dance, games and other activities.

Volunteer in a Deaf School

Most deaf people or those having hearing impaired do not have access to education or Sign Language training. It is therefore very difficult for deaf students to get proper education. Even at deaf school it is difficult to teach them due to the lack of curriculum.

Actually deaf students are easily motivated to learn reading and writing and equally eager to improve their skills. As a volunteer you will be together with these students up to 6 hours a day. Deaf children are particularly keen to learn English and so this is often the main role of a volunteer at the school. Based on the experience and skills, volunteers may also provide vocational training, other income generating training and introduce the use of new technology to these deaf people .So that it would be easier for them to run their lives later in the future.

This work can be very challenging because of all the different modes of communication used and learning difficulties encountered, but the staff at the school is always on hand to help you.
